'Don't panic. Do prepare.'

Neighborhoods and governments across the country should do their best to contain the spread of the virus and to protect vulnerable segments of the population, but those efforts could look different, said <u>Tom Russo</u>. Russo is a professor and chief of infectious disease at the University at Buffalo Jacobs School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences.

"The pieces of the puzzle we're missing is the prevalence of infection in society, and if you are asymptomatic, what is the relative risk of spreading the infection," he said, noting that it's hard to give a one-size-fits-all course of action for caring for older people.
